

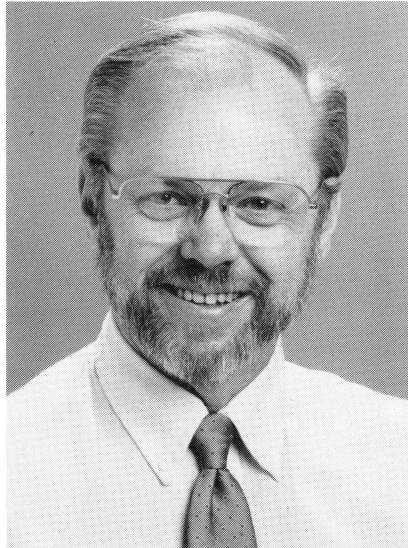

U. Eugene Brady, Jr.

1933 - 1989

U. Eugene Brady, Jr., professor of entomology at the University of Georgia, and past president of the Georgia Entomological Society, died February 15, 1989.

Dr. Brady was born July 18, 1933, in Selma, AL. He received a B.S. from Alabama Polytechnic Institute in 1959, an M.S. from Auburn University in 1960, and a Ph.D. from the University of Illinois in 1965. Prior to joining the faculty at the University of Georgia in 1965, Dr. Brady was with the Insects Affecting Man and Animals Research Laboratory, USDA-ARS at Gainesville, FL.



Dr. Brady's primary research interests were insecticide toxicology, and urban and industrial entomology. He also contributed significantly to research on identification and practical application of pheromones of Lepidoptera. Dr. Brady authored more than 100 publications.

Dr. Brady was a member of ESA, the American Chemical Society, the Georgia Entomological Society, the Institute of Chemical Ecology, the American Registry of Professional Entomologists (ARPE), the Georgia Pest Control Association, Gamma Sigma Delta, and Sigma Xi. Dr. Brady was active in the governance of professional societies, serving as president of the Georgia Entomological Society (1981-82); chairman of the Physiology, Biochemistry, and Toxicology section of ESA; a member of the ESA Governing Board; and a member of the ARPE Toxicology Examining Board.

Dr. Brady was profoundly interested in graduate education and spent much of this time directing and working with students. In recognition of his dedication to students, the Department of Entomology at the University of Georgia has established the U. E. Brady, Jr. Scholarship Fund in his honor to recognize outstanding students.

Dr. Brady is survived by his wife, Bobbie and two sons.
